### **Honoring the Flag and Women Veterans**



In 1777, the Second Continental Congress adopted the flag of the United States by a resolution stating that the original flag would consist of thirteen stripes and thirteen stars. The stripes would be red and white, and the stars would be white on a blue background. The flag was set in place to represent our nation, and though new stars were added to represent each state, the original design is still recognizable.

In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation to officially establish June 14 as Flag Day. National Flag Day was established by an Act of Congress on August 3, 1949, although it was not an official holiday.

The American flag is recognized around the globe, and at home, it remains a symbol of freedom, patriotism, and sacrifice. We see it at sporting events, flying at government buildings, and in our neighborhoods because it is dear to us.

Earlier this week, we all stood during Commissioners Court and pledged to our flag while being led by our Denton County employees, who are Women Veterans. They were honored in recognition of Texas Women Veterans Day, celebrated yearly on June 12.

These veterans understand the cost of the sacrifice, which is embedded in the symbols of our flag. The beauty of the words of the pledge was a moving moment during Commissioners Court. Before Commissioners Court, a breakfast honored our women veterans and their service.







During Commissioners Court, a proclamation recognized June 12 as **Texas Women Veterans Day**. Veterans were given quilts from Quilts of Valor, each created and stitched by local quilters.
Barbara Angel led the presentation, while Liz Emerson and Paul Bastaich with the Denton
County Veterans Services Office wrapped each recipient in their new quilt.



Barbara Angel, a volunteer with **Quilts of Valor** from the local Red, White, and Blue Bee, shared about the organization and its work to distribute quilts to veterans in Denton County and throughout the United States.

To date, over 393,000 quilts have been distributed nationwide to veterans. Quilts of Valor is a national organization that provides quilts to service members and veterans to give them comfort and healing.

On Tuesday, each veteran was not just given a quilt but lovingly wrapped in it. During this heartwarming quilting moment, the words "Welcome Home" were spoken to them. Ten women veterans were quilted this week, each receiving a unique symbol of our gratitude.









On Saturday, June 15, we had the honor of awarding a Vietnam vet who is a member of MOAA (Military Officers of America Assn). We award 5-6 a year to MOAA.

Saturday's recipient was retired Lt. Colonel Gene Koger, a 20 year vet of the US Army, and a Legion of Merit recipient.

I was assisted by RWB Bee member Sharon Balsley. Sharon is also a Vietnam veteran and a member of MOAA. She has assisted with MOAA awards in the past and it was a pleasure for her to come on Saturday.

Lt. Col Koger and his wife were so pleased with their QOV and surprised by its generous size. I'm told it will be displayed in their living room, and used this winter. The quilt was pieced by Mary Devlin and quilted by Cathy Kreter.

It was good to have Sharon Balsley join me in awarding this quilt.
